### Objectives and Investment Policy

Franklin Mutual European Fund (the "Fund") is classified as Article 8 under EU Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation and aims to increase the value of its investments and, secondarily, to earn income over the medium to long term.

The Fund pursues an actively managed investment strategy and invests mainly in:

- equity securities issued by companies of any size located in European countries

The Fund can invest to a lesser extent in:

- equity securities issued by companies involved in mergers, consolidations, liquidations or other major corporate transactions
- debt securities of any quality (including lower quality debt such as non-investment grade securities) of companies involved in reorganisation or financial restructuring
- securities of non-European issuers (up to 10% of assets)
- derivatives for hedging, efficient portfolio management and/or investment purposes

Although the Fund generally invests in at least five countries, it may invest in as few as one or two. The Fund currently intends to invest principally in securities of issuers in western Europe. The investment team uses in-depth, fundamental research and analysis to find and purchase those equity and debt securities that are believed to be trading at a discount.

The benchmark of the Fund is the Linked MSCI Europe Value Index-NR. The

benchmark is used solely as a reference for Investors to compare against the Fund's performance, and the benchmark is neither used as a constraint on how the Fund's portfolio is to be constructed nor set as a target for the Fund's performance to beat. The Fund can deviate from the benchmark.

You may request the sale of your shares on any Dealing Day (as defined in the current prospectus of the Fund).

The income received from the Fund's investments is accumulated with the result of increasing the value of the shares.

### Terms to Understand

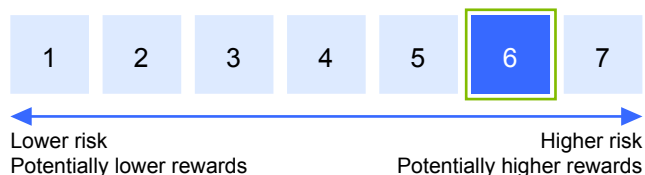
**Debt securities:** Securities representing the issuer's obligation to repay a loan at a specified date and to pay interest.

**Derivatives:** Financial instruments whose characteristics and value depend on the performance of one or more underlying assets, typically securities, indexes, currencies or interest rates.

**Equity securities:** Securities that represent an ownership stake in a company.

**Hedging:** A strategy for totally or partially offsetting particular risks such as those arising from fluctuations in share prices, currencies or interest rates.

#### Why is the Fund in this specific category?

The Fund invests mainly in equity and equity-related securities of companies located in or doing significant business in European countries. Such

securities have historically been subject to significant price movements that may occur suddenly due to market or company-specific factors. As a result, the performance of the Fund can fluctuate significantly over relatively short time periods.

#### Risks materially relevant not adequately captured by the indicator:

**Derivative Instruments risk:** the risk of loss in an instrument where a small change in the value of the underlying investment may have a larger impact on the value of such instrument. Derivatives may involve additional liquidity, credit and counterparty risks.

**Foreign Currency risk:** the risk of loss arising from exchange-rate fluctuations or due to exchange control regulations.

**Liquidity risk:** the risk that arises when adverse market conditions affect the ability to sell assets when necessary. 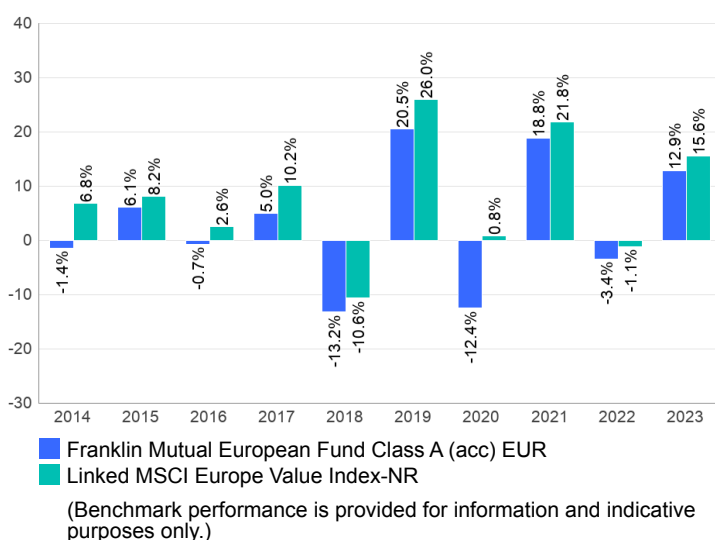
