Objectives and Investment Policy

Templeton Euroland Fund (the "Fund") aims to increase the value of its investments over the medium to long term.

The Fund pursues an actively managed investment strategy and invests mainly in:

• equity securities issued by companies of any size located in, or doing significant business in, countries that have adopted the euro as their national currency (i.e., countries of the European Monetary Union)

The Fund can invest to a lesser extent in:

- derivatives for hedging and efficient portfolio management
- structured products (such as equity-linked notes)

The investment team uses in-depth analysis to select individual securities that it believes are undervalued and will provide the best opportunities for increased value over the long term. The Fund invests at least 75% of its total assets in equity securities issued by companies that have their head office in the European Union.

The benchmark of the Fund is the MSCI EMU Index-NR. The benchmark is used solely as a reference for Investors to compare against the Fund's performance, and the benchmark is neither used as a constraint on how the Fund's portfolio is to be constructed nor set as a target for the Fund's

performance to beat. The Fund can deviate from the benchmark.

You may request the sale of your shares on any Dealing Day (as defined in the current prospectus of the Fund).

The income received from the Fund's investments is accumulated with the result of increasing the value of the shares.

Terms to Understand

Derivatives: Financial instruments whose characteristics and value depend on the performance of one or more underlying assets, typically securities, indexes, currencies or interest rates.

Equity securities: Securities that represent an ownership stake in a company.

Structured products: Packaged financial products whose value is generally linked to underlying asset(s) that are typically created to satisfy a need that cannot be met by investing solely in standard financial instruments available in the market.

Why is the Fund in this specific category?

The Fund invests mainly in equity securities of companies located in or doing

significant business in euroland countries. Such securities have historically been subject to significant price movements that may occur suddenly due to market or company-specific factors. As a result, the performance of the Fund can fluctuate significantly over relatively short time periods.

Risks materially relevant not adequately captured by the indicator:

Derivative Instruments risk: the risk of loss in an instrument where a small change in the value of the underlying investment may have a larger impact on the value of such instrument. Derivatives may involve additional liquidity, credit and counterparty risks.


